



What we know

Jesus will come...

As the Son of man in His Kingdom On the clouds in glory Preceded by signs

- wars
- earthquakes
- famines
- persecutions
- false prophets
- darkening of sun and the moon
- Gospel preached to all the earth

The Rest of the New Testament

What we know

Jesus will come...

He will come back the same way as He went Imminently
The Lord Himself will come down
There will be terrible times in the last days
We're living in the last days
His coming is near
To a specific place (Mt of Olives)



Revelation The Millennium (1000 years)



A post millennial view

2nd coming follows the millennium Church will Christianise the world (evangelise and prepare) This will be the millennium followed by Armageddon and the return of Christ Simultaneous resurrection and final judgement

An a-millennial view

No physical millennial reign

2nd coming preceded by apostasy and wickedness

Antichrist will appear and Christ will defeat him at His coming

Simultaneous resurrection and final judgement

A pre-millennial view

Millennia is literally 1000 years 2 returns, one <u>for</u> His people, the other <u>with</u> His people Antichrist ultimately defeated at the battle of Armageddon Jesus reigns for 1000 years, then Satan let loose, initiates rebellion and is then defeated Eternal state initiated



Revelation over-emphasis The Millennium (1000 years)



A post millennial view

Influenced many missionary movements, prepare the world for Christ return William Millar – 7th Day Adventists. The end is 1843 then 22 Oct 1844 Charles Taize Russell -> Joseph Franklin Rutherford (the end is 1926) Led to Jehovah's Witnesses in 1931 Resurrection completed in 1881, millennium kingdom started in 1914 Christ and the 144,000 rule since then Conversion the way to avoid consequences of Armageddon

An a-millennial view

Held by Augustine
Satan bound from the time of the birth Christ until His second coming
New Jerusalem is already here in each believer, we are part of that New Jerusalem

A pre-millennial view

Held by the early church fathers, Papias, Justin Martyr, Irenaeus, Tertullian Saints will be resurrected and live in peace for 1000 years in greatly enlarged Jerusalem Peter the Hermit used this model to recruit huge numbers for the 1095 crusade Joachim of Fiore influenced Richard the Lionheart in the same way for the third crusade





Beware those who think they know the date!

The Millennium is a metaphor which symbolises God's triumph over evil in the person of Jesus Christ and the vindication of the victims of oppression and injustice



But what about the role of Israel?



The Messiah will come – the place of Israel and Jerusalem

I will save my people from the countries of the East and the West – I will bring them back to live in Jerusalem

Zech 8 v 7

Written after the return from the exile

In that day the Lord will reach out His hand a <u>second</u> time to reclaim the remnant Is 11 v 11, 12

Dry bones brought to life then imbued with the spirit Physical return then spiritual return of the Jews to Israel

Ezek 37 v 1 -14

The land will be to small Only 50,000 returned after the exile

Is 49 v 19 - 20

Return of the Jews to the 'one they have pierced' Spiritual awakening and openness

Zech 12 v 1



Jerusalem and Rome



Two important cities in our understanding of the Second Coming

<u>Jerusalem</u>

The Second coming of Christ is almost certainly linked to the coming of the Jewish Messiah. Christians too should look forward to:

Next year in Jerusalem - Le'shana hab'ah b' Yerushalayim

(The restoration of the state of Israel is probably important in cosmic history)

<u>Rome</u>

The role of Rome at the time when Revelation was written is also important Understanding the Roman Empire probably gives Revelation a context If we fail to take it into account we will probably read too much into the text



Why is Rome Critical?



Greek Philosophical dualism and thought

The end of the physical world and the coming of a new age belonging to the eternal world

Hebrew Philosophy and prophecy

The New Age will be established on earth

Hence John in Revelation wants to

- Rid the world of the beast
- Have God and the Lamb on the throne on earth

Cosmic collapse for John in Revelation does not mean the end of the world It does mean the end of an idolatrous imperial power (Rome)

Why is Rome Critical?



Revelation is a critique of the effects of the ideology of the Roman Empire, a systematic expose of evil, and shows the alternative on offer in Christ

- Some Christians has compromised their faith by accepting some of the precepts

Revelation presents a vision of an alternate symbolic universe where the world has become the Kingdom of the Messiah who will reign for ever

Revelation Chapter 13 & 17

The Lamb and the Beast and the Harlot

The beast rises out of the sea...

...the Roman proconsul would rise over the horizon on the Aegean Sea on his annual visit to Asia Minor...

The beast has 7 heads, the seven hills on which the harlot sits...

- the beast can be taken to symbolise Rome's military might
- the harlot can be taken to symbolise Rome's civilisation

The harlot rides the beast

- Rome's civilisation was being supported by military might



Links with OT Imagery



Revelation Chapter 4 v 1 - 11

God is on his throne – the court takes on the appearance of the Temple

4 living creatures

- seraphim from Isaiah 6
- cherubim from Ezekiel 1
- cherubim at the Temple Mercy Seat from Exodus 35
- cry out 'Our Lord and God' (cf Domitian's demands)

Revelation Chapter 5 v 5, 6

The Lamb open seals and things begin to happen...

The Lamb is described as Lion of Judah, Root of David, Messianic titles BUT

The Lamb appears slain, the writer sees the marks of slaughter

When Jewish expectation is turned into vision and reality...

...we see the Christian understanding of redemption and salvation

Ultimately it is the Lamb who is worshipped, not Caesar or the Roman Empire



The New Jerusalem



A Vision of a New and Alternate Society
A New Heaven and a New Earth
The New World Order that comes with the Second Advent

The Old has passed away – God now dwells with humanity as His bride The New Jerusalem is the bride of the Lamb

The city is 12,000 cubits long, high (= $\underline{144,000}$) - its also a cubical, 12,000 high Same dimensions as the Holy of Holies in the Temple, only $\underline{1000}$ times bigger There is no Temple in the New Jerusalem, it is all Temple People are drawn to the New Jerusalem to worship

'The nations will walk by its light, and the kings of the earth will bring their glory into it. Its gates are always open. People bring their honour and the glory of the nations into it. Nothing unclean will enter it. Those who enter will be written in the Lamb's book of life...' Rev 21 v 24 - 27

Its particular <u>and</u> universal, it's the 144,000 <u>and</u> the great multitude It's the people of God <u>and</u> the nations at large



The New Jerusalem



A Vision of a New and Alternate Society
A New Heaven and a New Earth
The New World Order that comes with the Second Advent

...the leaves of the tree of life are for the healing of the nations ...there will be no more night, they will need no lamp or sun for God will be their light

Its not just a blueprint for a new city, it's a new quality of life in the new age

The faithful don't escape to a heavenly world, but life on a renewed earth The faithful are not taken up into a New Jerusalem, it comes down to them

The Lamb that was slain is now raised to life

The message of Revelation is primarily a message of hope
John is convinced of the second coming but in reality tells us little about it



The Second Advent



What does it mean for us?

The Kingdom was inaugurated when Christ came, but still awaits in consummation Then God's intentions revealed in Jesus will triumphantly fulfilled

Christ second coming marks the completion of the work began at Bethlehem We should be more concerned with the purpose of Christ's coming than the timing - Christ will come to welcome His people into His presence

We, as Christians, are part of His people and will come into His presence

We are to look to the future, in the hope that Christ gives us

BUT

The Millennium and the New Jerusalem are not only hope for the future...
...they are an agenda for the present

Christ will come again!!

It will probably be a bit noisy

Israel will probably be important

We will probably know its happening

We don't know the time
